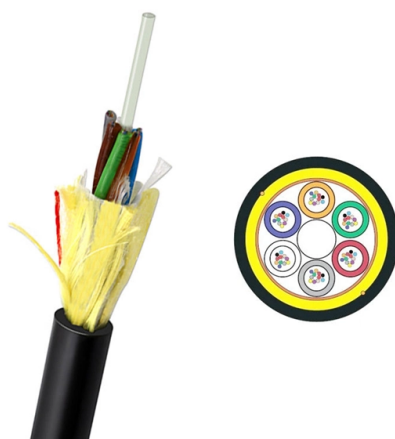


Adding a router to an FTTR fiber optic network

To connect a fiber optic FTTR setup to a router, you typically use an Optical Network Terminal (ONT) to convert the fiber signal to Ethernet, then link it to your router's WAN port or SFP module if supported.

- Connect the ONT to the router:** Use an Ethernet cable from the ONT's LAN/Ethernet port to the router's WAN port. If your router supports an SFP module, you may insert the fiber directly into the SFP port, following ISP compatibility requirements.
- Power on the router:** Wait for the router's indicator lights to confirm connectivity.
- Configure the router:** Access the admin panel via a browser (e.g., 192.168.1.1) and set up the connection type, typically PPPoE or DHCP, as specified by your ISP.

Tips for Optimal Performance

- Place the ONT and router near power outlets and in a dry, ventilated area.
- Avoid bending the fiber cable sharply; maintain gentle curves to prevent signal loss.
- Use high-quality Ethernet cables (Cat6a or higher) to preserve gigabit speeds.
- Enable Quality of Service (QoS) on the router if you use VoIP or video conferencing...
