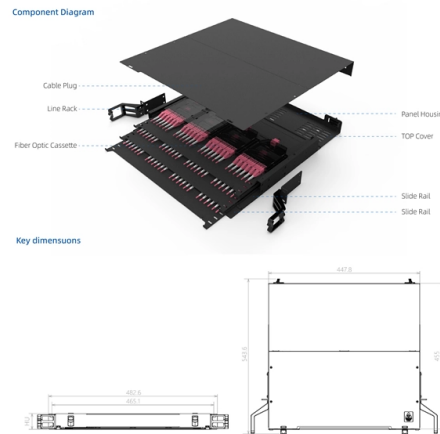

It uses a single optical fiber from an Optical Line Terminal (OLT) to serve multiple Optical Network Terminals (ONTs) or Optical Network Units (ONUs) through passive splitters, supporting downstream speeds up to 2.4 Gbps and upstream speeds up to 1.2 Gbps. GPON is popular because it reduces infrastructure costs, simplifies maintenance, and allows multiple users to share a single fiber efficiently. Other Technologies in FTTP While GPON is common, FTTP networks can also use other technologies: EPON (Ethernet PON): Uses Ethernet frames over a PON architecture, often preferred in regions with existing Ethernet infrastructure. XG-PON / XGS-PON: Next-generation PON standards offering higher speeds (up to 10 Gbps downstream). Point-to-Point Fiber: Direct fiber connections from the central office to each user, bypassing passive splitters, often used in enterprise or high-demand scenarios. The choice of technology depends on factors like bandwidth requirements, deployment cost, scalability, and service provider strategy.
