

Buried junction boxes need to be grounded

Buried or Concealed Installations Junction boxes cannot be permanently buried under soil, concrete, or building finishes without access. NEC requires that all boxes remain accessible for inspection, maintenance, and future modifications (NEC 314.29). For underground installations, boxes must be rated for wet or damp locations, typically using corrosion-resistant materials and weatherproof covers if exposed to moisture. Practical Grounding Methods For buried boxes, grounding can be established by: Connecting a copper grounding wire from the box to a ground rod or grounding system. Using approved bonding connectors or clips to attach the box to the equipment grounding conductor. Ensuring all metal conduits entering the box are bonded to maintain a continuous grounding path.
