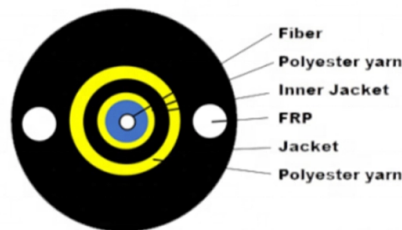


Calculation of optical cable return loss
