

Can a Layer 2 switch be connected to fiber optic cable

- Secure and Protect:** Route the fiber carefully to avoid sharp bends, kinks, or stress. Use conduits or cable management to protect the fiber.

Switch Configuration

- Enable the Interface:** On most switches, SFP ports are administratively down by default. Use the command-line interface (CLI) or GUI to issue a no shutdown command on the SFP interface.
- Verify Link Status:** Check the interface status with commands like show interface status or show ip interface brief to ensure the link is up.
- Configure VLANs:** Assign the SFP port to the appropriate VLAN if needed, just like a regular Ethernet port.
- Optional Link Aggregation:** For higher bandwidth or redundancy, you can configure port trunking or link aggregation if multiple fiber links are used.
