Overview

A concrete cold joint forms when a pour delay lets one lift set before the next is placed, so the two never bond. It is a placement and timing issue, not a plywood defect. Here are the real causes, the time limit, how it differs from a planned construction joint, and how to. A cold joint in concrete is an area or surface with a structural discontinuity caused by the delayed concrete pouring between two layers of concrete. This is known as a concrete cold joint. The visible change between the two concrete surfaces could be a slight difference in color or texture. Sudden pain affecting multiple joints can result from infections such as the flu or COVID-19, post-viral complications, myalgic encephalomyelitis/chronic fatigue syndrome (ME/CFS), gout, or some autoimmune conditions.
