

Configuration of Gigabit Fiber Integrated Switch



AI Overview

Configuring a Gigabit Fiber Integrated Switch involves installing the appropriate fiber modules, setting port modes, and managing interfaces via CLI or GUI tools.

Fiber Module Installation For switches that use GBIC or SFP modules, ensure you select the correct type for your network:

- 1000Base-SX for multi-mode fiber up to 550 m
- 1000Base-LX/LH for single-mode fiber up to 10 km
- 1000Base-ZX for long-haul single-mode fiber up to 70 km (or 100 km with premium fiber)

Installation steps generally include removing the module from packaging, verifying the part number, inserting it into the switch slot until it clicks, and then connecting the fiber cable while observing laser safety precautions.

Interface Configuration Gigabit Ethernet interfaces can be configured for access or trunk modes depending on your network topology. Key configuration steps include:

- Assigning the interface to a logical unit and specifying the ethernet-switching family
- Enabling autonegotiation for speed and duplex settings
- Configuring link aggregation (802.3ad) if combining multiple ports
- Setting storm control and enabling RSTP/LLDP for network stability

For switches with SGMII or SerDes ports, these interfaces allow connection to fiber transceivers or other switches. SGMII supports multiple speeds (10/100/1000 Mbps), while SerDes mode is strictly 1 Gbps full duplex.

Management Options Managed Gigabit fiber switches can be configured via:

- CLI through an RJ45 serial console using a rollover cable
- Web GUI or management software such as UNMS for EdgeSwitch devices, which allows monitoring, firmware upgrades, and backup of configurations

Power and Redundancy Some switches support redundant DC power inputs. You can connect a secondary power source to ensure uninterrupted operation if the primary AC/DC supply fails.
