Connecting to Patch Cables: The connector end of the pigtail is plugged into a fiber patch cable, which then connects to network devices or optical transceivers. Common connector types include LC, SC, ST, and FC, chosen based on network requirements.

Distribution and Termination: The distribution box allows multiple fibers to be split and routed efficiently. For example, a 4-core incoming cable can be spliced to four pigtails, each leading to a separate patch cable and device.
