

Construction of cable trays under the wall

Cable trays under walls are fabricated using metal support structures, mounted at regular intervals, and isolated to ensure safe and durable cable routing. Materials and Support Structures Cable trays are typically fabricated from Mild Steel (MS) or Galvanized Iron (GI), with perforated or solid designs depending on ventilation and load requirements. Wall-mounted supports are commonly made from MS angles (e.g., 50 x 50 mm, 6 mm thick), spaced at 1-meter intervals along the wall. For longer spans, bridge supports using MS C-channels (e.g., 150 x 75 mm, 5.7 mm thick) can be welded to the existing structure to maintain stability. Mounting and Fastening Supports are fastened to the wall using high-strength bolts, such as Hilti nut bolts of at least 75 mm length. Cable trays are then mounted on these supports using high-tensile bolts, washers, and nuts, with coupler plates connecting tray sections securely. Proper alignment and leveling are essential to maintain the tray's horizontal run and prevent sagging. Isolation and Protection To prevent electrical conduction or corrosion, G-10 or FRP sheets (e.g., 400 x 100 mm, 10 mm thick) are placed between the tray and the support at each mounting point. This ensures electrical isolation and reduces mechanical wear. Additionally, bends, T-pieces, and other fittings are fabricated with adequate radius to maintain the minimum bend radius for cables and avoid damage. Finishing After fabrication and welding, the MS support structure should be primed with red oxide and finished with enamel paint (e.g., Siemens grey) to protect against corrosion and provide a smooth surface. Standards and Safety Considerations Cable trays and supports should comply with BS EN 61537 or equivalent standards for mechanical and electrical performance. They are designed to support cables, not personnel, and must withstand imposed loads such as cable weight and short-circuit forces.
