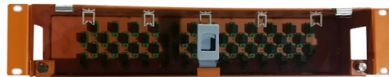


Grounding requirements for construction site electrical distribution boxes and switches



Overview

NFPA 70: National Electrical Code Article 250 covers the minimum requirements for grounding and bonding and, although the NEC lists requirements to abide by, it should not be taken as a design manual. Ground-fault circuit interrupters. OSHA's grounding requirements are spelled out primarily in two sets of regulations: 29 CFR 1910 Subpart S for general industry workplaces, and 29 CFR 1926 Subpart K for. This subpart addresses electrical safety requirements that are necessary for the practical safeguarding of employees involved in construction work and is divided into four major divisions and applicable definitions as follows: (a) Installation safety requirements. For grounded systems, the NEC requires you to perform all of the following: electrical system. 1. 7 Provide conduit grounding bushings, bonded together and connected to the equipment enclosure on all incoming and outgoing conduits on distribution switchgear and switchboards, distribution panels and on all conduits over 1-1/4" diameter at all panelboards, pull boxes and equipment.
