

How high should the protection level of the distribution box be

- Proper grounding and earthing are essential to prevent electrical faults.
- For sensitive equipment, integrate surge protection devices (SPDs):
 - Type 1 SPD:** Main entry point protection against lightning surges.
 - Type 2 SPD:** Distribution-level protection for residual overvoltages.
 - Type 3 SPD:** Equipment-level protection for sensitive electronics.

Installation and Maintenance

- Install in dry, accessible areas with good ventilation, typically around 1.5 meters height for easy access.
- Use rust-proof, UV-resistant materials for outdoor or humid locations.
- Regularly inspect and maintain the box, checking SPDs, breakers, and insulation integrity.
- Label circuits clearly and consider modular designs for future upgrades.
