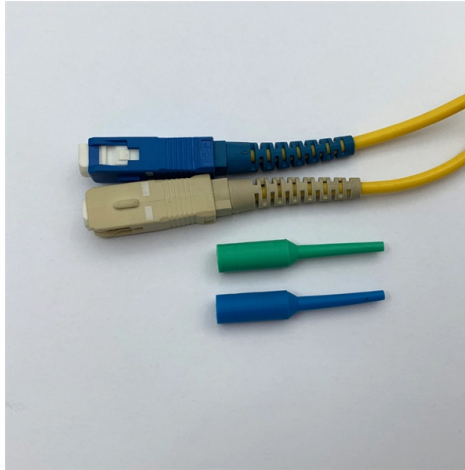


How many supports per meter for fire cable trays



Overview

Cable tray support quantity can be calculated using a simple formula: Support Quantity = Total Length ÷ Support Spacing + 1 $20 \div 2 + 1 = 11$ supports In a typical project, a 20-meter cable tray with 2-meter spacing requires 11 supports. Horizontal deviation: $\leq 2\text{mm}$ per meter. Must be level, plumb, and securely mounted on supports. Use dedicated splice plates and.
