

How to connect the fiber optic networking panel

Media Converters: For networks that mix copper Ethernet and fiber, use fiber-to-Ethernet media converters to bridge connections while maintaining electrical isolation .

Step 5: Test the Connections After connecting, test each fiber link using a fiber optic cable tester to ensure proper signal transmission and identify any faults . Verify that all devices connected through the...
