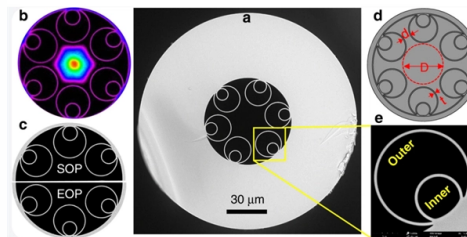


How to ground a fiber optic cable line

Armored or metallic fiber optic cables must be bonded and grounded to comply with NEC standards, while all-dielectric cables generally do not require grounding. Grounding Armored Fiber Optic Cable

Expose the Armor: After accessing the cable, remove the outer jacket to expose the metallic armor or strength members.

Attach a Bonding Conductor: Use a UL-listed copper or corrosion-resistant conductor, typically 6-AWG, to maintain electrical continuity between the cable armor and the building grounding system. The conductor can be insulated or bare.

Use a Listed Clamp or Lug: Secure the bonding conductor to the armor using a UL-listed clamp, lug, or connector as specified in NEC Article 250.70. This ensures a reliable electrical connection.

Protect the Connection: Apply vinyl tape around the clamp and exposed armor to prevent sharp edges from damaging the cable or injuring the installer.

Connect to Grounding System: Bond the conductor to the intersystem bonding termination or another accessible grounding point that connects to the building's grounding electrode, completing the path to earth.

Special Considerations

Point of Entry: Ground metallic members as close as practicable to the point where the cable enters a building or contacts power conductors.

Insulating Joints: If an insulating joint or equivalent device interrupts the metallic member, grounding may not be necessary even if the cable is exposed to power.
