

How to handle a core switch failure

- Active-Active or Active-Standby Core Switches:** Deploy two high-end core switches with redundant links and synchronized control planes. If one switch fails, the other immediately assumes forwarding responsibilities, minimizing downtime.
- Cisco VSS or Nexus vPC:** These technologies merge two physical switches into a single logical entity, allowing active-active forwarding and sub-second failover. Downstream devices perceive no topology change, maintaining uninterrupted connectivity.
- Redundant Power and Links:** Ensure dual power feeds, redundant uplinks, and load-sharing configurations to prevent single points of failure.

Recovery and Restoration

- Failover Testing:** Simulate switch or PSU failures to confirm redundancy mechanisms work as expected.
- Replace or Repair Faulty Hardware:** Swap out defective modules, PSUs, or the switch chassis if necessary.
- Restore Configuration:** If the switch firmware or configuration is corrupted, reload from a backup or reapply the correct configuration.
