

How to remove the network module from the cable management rack



Overview

Loosen the hook and loop strap binding the cables to the cable management device, and then unplug the system cables and SFPs (if needed) from the controller module, keeping track of where the cables were connected. Cisco Catalyst 9300 switches can share bandwidth by using data stacking. The following table lists the supported stacking options: Table 1.
