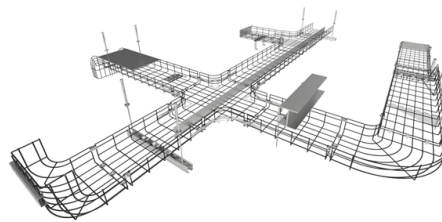


How to set up a router to connect to fiber optic internet

Enable Quality of Service (QoS) if you need to prioritize traffic for gaming, video calls, or VoIP.

Use wired connections for critical devices to achieve maximum speed and low latency.

Place the router in a central, well-ventilated location away from moisture and heat sources.
