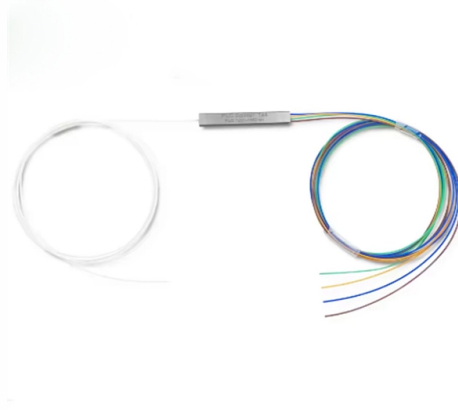

- Verify Fiber and Connector Type: Physically inspect the connector and fiber color coding. Multi-fiber pigtails follow TIA/EIA-598-A color standards for easy identification.
- Consult Manufacturer Documentation: Product datasheets and ordering guides provide full decoding instructions for part numbers, including optional features like armored or waterproof pigtails.
