

How to use a switch for optical fiber migration

Step 5: Verify Compatibility and Bandwidth Confirm that the transceiver supports the desired network speed (1G, 10G, or higher) and that the switch firmware recognizes the module. Some switches may require configuration to enable the SFP port ().

Step 6: Cable Management and Safety For outdoor or long runs, protect fiber cables using conduits and avoid sharp bends to prevent signal loss or damage. Multi-mode fiber is generally sufficient for short distances, while single-mode is preferred for longer runs ().
