

Insert fiber optic splice box



AI Overview

Proper installation of a fiber optic splice box ensures secure, low-loss connections and long-term network reliability.

Step 1: Cable Preparation Begin by removing the outer jacket of the fiber optic cable, including any shielding or armor, to expose the loose tubes. Leave approximately 3 meters of cable for preparation. Clean the exposed fibers and strength members using a suitable cleaning solution, and abrade the outer jacket for about 150 mm to ensure proper sealing. Remove any excess filling material and ensure the fibers are free of debris.

Step 2: Mounting the Splice Box Select a suitable location for the splice box, considering accessibility and environmental protection. Use the provided fixing points to mount the enclosure. For concrete surfaces, use expansion bolts, and for steel frames, use appropriately sized bolts with anti-vibration washers. Ensure the enclosure is level and secure, and verify that the IP-rated cover is properly fitted to maintain environmental protection.

Step 3: Cable Entry and Sealing Choose sealing rings that match the cable diameter. Insert the cable into the designated entry port and secure it with the sealing rings. Wrap self-adhesive sealing tape between the rings to create a tight seal, then use a hose clamp or other securing mechanism to fix the cable to the base of the splice closure. Ground any metallic shielding or strength members to prevent electrical interference.

Step 4: Fiber Splicing Organize the fibers inside the splice box using splice trays. Depending on the network requirements, use either fusion splicing for permanent, low-loss connections or mechanical splicing for faster field deployment. Ensure fibers are cut to the proper length to allow neat storage in the trays and avoid bending beyond the minimum bend radius. Arrange fibers carefully to prevent stress or damage.

Step 5: Closure and Final Checks After splicing, carefully coil the fibers in the trays and close the splice box. Verify that all fibers are properly secured, the enclosure is sealed, and there is no strain on the cables. Perform a visual inspection...
