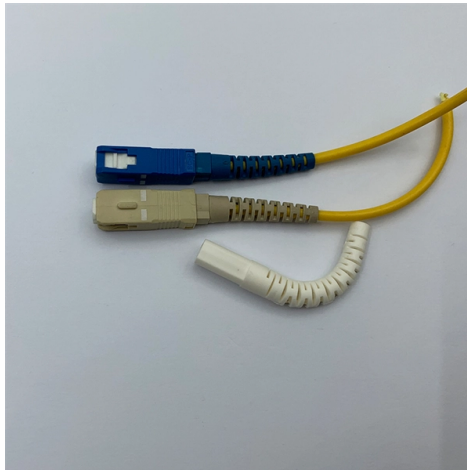


Insert the pigtail cable into the fiber optic patch panel
