Intermediate Supports When extending trays, install supports at recommended intervals to prevent deflection and maintain safe load distribution. Material thickness and tray type determine maximum span between supports.

Planning for Future Expansion Even when extending trays, maintain 40–50% fill ratio for power and control cables to allow for heat dissipation and future cable additions. Oversized trays are acceptable if they provide room for growth without compromising structural efficiency.

Overcrowded or improperly joined trays can lead to overheating, cable damage, and inspection failures.
