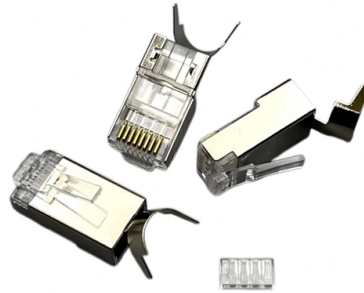

This often involves using earthed conduits, trunking, or protective plates to meet safety standards like BS 7671 in the UK. Cable trays themselves, being open, are generally not used in fully concealed applications, as they require accessibility for inspection and maintenance.
