Standard 12-Color Sequence for Fibers

To identify a specific fiber, locate the tube number (tube color) and then the fiber position within that tube (fiber color). For instance, Fiber #34 in a 48-fiber cable would be the 10th fiber (Violet) in the 3rd tube (Green).

MPO and High-Density Cables
For 16-fiber MPO connectors, fibers 13-16 are assigned specific colors:
13: Olive
14: Magenta
15: Tan
16: Lime
High-density ribbon cables may use additional markings, such as rings or stripes, to distinguish fibers beyond the standard 12-color sequence.

Cable Jacket Colors
Fiber optic cable jackets also follow color conventions to indicate fiber type and performance:
Indoor/Plenum Cables: Typically orange for OM1/OM2, aqua for OM3/OM4, and yellow for single-mode OS2.
Outdoor/OSP Cables: Black, green, or other colors may indicate armored or specialized cables.
