

Methods for stacking cable trays

 - Wire Basket Tray:** Flexible and lightweight, suitable for overhead or underfloor installations. Can be suspended from permanent structures or attached to parallel walls, offering easy access for cable management.

- Support Spacing:** Follow manufacturer recommendations for maximum span between supports to prevent sagging. Ladder trays typically allow longer spans due to their structural strength.

- Secure Fastening:** Use through-bolts, clamps, or brackets to prevent trays from shifting. Avoid relying solely on tray weight for stability.
