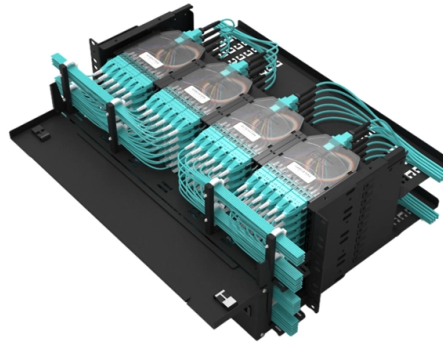


Monitoring Room Aggregation Switch

Deployment in Monitoring Rooms In a monitoring room or data center, TAPs or SPAN Ports are deployed at strategic network points to capture traffic. These feeds are connected to the aggregation switch, which consolidates the data. The switch then distributes the traffic to multiple monitoring systems, allowing simultaneous analysis by different tools.
