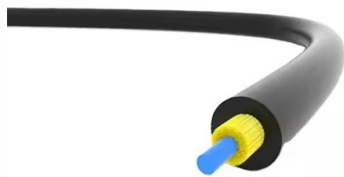


Requirements for secondary power distribution boxes on construction sites

Grounding is mandatory for the metal box, electrical installation board, and all metallic components inside the box.
