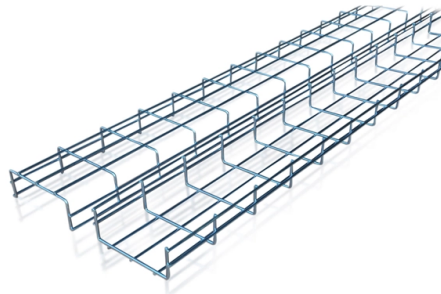


Shared cable trays for low-voltage and fire protection systems

 - Perforated or Ventilated Tray:** Allows airflow to reduce heat buildup, which is important for both low-voltage and fire protection cables.Ensure the tray can handle the total weight and future expansion of all cables, including a 20–30% growth margin for low-voltage systems.
- 3. Separation Within the Tray** If sharing a tray is unavoidable: Use dividers or separate channels to segregate low-voltage and fire protection cables. Maintain minimum spacing to reduce electromagnetic interference and prevent heat accumulation. Avoid running high-current power cables in the same tray as sensitive low-voltage or fire alarm circuits.
- 4. Firestopping and Penetrations** Where cable trays pass through walls, floors, or slabs, firestopping is mandatory to maintain the fire rating of the structure: Use fire-rated boards, mineral wool, firestop packs, or intumescent caulks to seal gaps. Ensure gaps around cables do not exceed recomm...
