

Spacing between conduits in distribution boxes



Overview

This guide gives you clear spacing rules, how to measure them in the field, and quick reference tables for each common conduit type—EMT, RMC, IMC, FMC, LFMC, LFNC, ENT, and PVC—based on the 2023 National Electrical Code® (NEC). A duct bank is an underground network of conduits (typically PVC, HDPE, or concrete) encased in concrete to provide a protected pathway for electrical cables, communication lines, or other utilities. Duct banks are widely used in industrial plants, power distribution networks, and commercial.
