Environmental Conditions: Outdoor installations, high humidity, or corrosive environments may require closer spacing to maintain structural integrity and prevent corrosion-related failures.

Installation Type: Ceiling-mounted trays may allow longer spans than wall-mounted trays, but vertical runs or bends may require additional supports.
