- DIN 25 mm Pitch System:** Some cabinets use 5 mm diameter holes spaced 32 mm apart in two vertical rows for flexible mounting.

- Cage Nuts:** Often used with square or round holes to accommodate different screw types, especially M6 screws.
- Pre-tapped Rails:** Some racks come with threaded holes for #10-32 or #12-24 screws, eliminating the need for cage nuts.
- Material and Finish:** Rack screw surfaces are typically treated to prevent rust and ensure secure mounting.
