Safety Considerations: Proper earthing is essential to prevent electric shock. Use standard color codes for wires (e.g., brown/red for live, blue for neutral, green/yellow for earth). Practical Tips Label wires at both ends to avoid confusion during installation. Use single-core copper wires for standard domestic loads; for high-power devices, consider heavier gauge wires. Always switch off the main MCB before performing any wiring work in the distribution box. Ensure switches and breakers are rated appropriately for the connected load to prevent tripping or overheating.
