Management Aggregation switches often handle inter-VLAN routing, access control, and security enforcement, acting as a policy hub before traffic reaches the core. They can filter traffic, implement QoS priorities, manage multicast traffic, and perform IP address translation, ensuring that the network operates efficiently and securely.
