- Optical Modules:** Use SFP/SFP+ for 1G-10G uplinks and QSFP/QSFP28 for 40G-100G aggregation. Single-mode fiber with LR/ER optics is recommended for distances over 10 km.
- Scalability:** Fiber aggregation allows easy expansion by adding more switches or fiber links without major infrastructure changes.
