Proper spacing around the box is required to provide safe working clearances. Electrical Components and Wiring Inside the SDB, busbars, terminal blocks, and breakers must be sized according to the expected load and fault current . Busbars should be copper with tin or nickel plating to prevent corrosion, and conductors should be recessed or finger-safe to reduce accidental contact . Wiring should be neat, color-coded, and properly insulated, with secure connections to breakers and terminals . Grounding and earthing are essential to protect personnel and equipment from electrical faults . Protection and Labeling Each circuit should have its own protection device, and surge protection may be included for sensitive equipment . All components, including meter sockets in multi-metered setups, must be clearly labeled with permanent, weather-r...
