These cables are suitable for direct burial, duct installations, aerial networks, and industrial environments, ensuring reliable data transmission under harsh conditions.
- 2. Optical Ground Wire (OPGW)** OPGW cables combine optical fibers with a metallic ground wire used in high-voltage power transmission lines. They serve a dual purpose: lightning protection for the power line and data communication through embedded optical fibers. OPGW is typically deployed on 110kV to 500kV lines and features a metal armor layer that resists electrical corrosion and mechanical stress. It is mainly used in new high-voltage lines due to construction requirements and safety considerations.
- 3. Optical/Metallic Hybrid Cables** These cables integrate both optical fibers and metallic wires for telecommunication and/or power feeding. According to ITU-T L.109, hybrid cables are classified into three types:
 - Type I: Metallic wires for communication only
 - Type II: Metallic wires for power feeding only
 - Type III: Metallic wires for both communication and power feedingHybrid cables are used in distributed antenna systems (DAS), fiber-to-the-antenna (FTTA) applications, and other scenarios requiring simultaneous data and limited power transmission.
