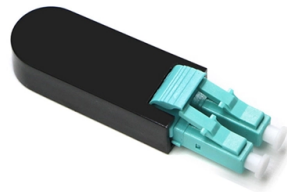

Outdoor or underground installations: Standard tray cables must be in conduit if not rated for direct burial, and conduit provides protection against UV, moisture, and extreme weather . Hazardous or classified locations: Chemical plants, explosive atmospheres, or damp environments often mandate conduit for safety . Transition to equipment: When cables leave a tray and enter equipment, they may pass through bushed conduit or flanged openings to prevent abrasion and debris entry, as required by NEC 392.46 .
