

## Where is the fiber optic connector plugged in

Ensure the connector type matches the ONT port. Avoid bending the fiber sharply or applying excessive force, as this can degrade signal quality.

**Final Steps** Power on the ONT first, allowing it to establish a connection with your ISP. Power on the router afterward. Check status lights on the ONT and router to confirm a successful connection. Proper handling and secure insertion of the fiber connector into the ONT ensures optimal network performance and prevents signal loss.
