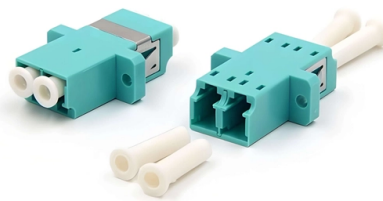


Where to connect the live wire in the distribution box

Always turn off the main supply before working inside the distribution box. Use properly rated MCBs and RCCBs according to your load requirements. Ensure the live wire is securely tightened in the terminal to prevent overheating or arcing. Maintain clear separation between live, neutral, and earth wires to avoid short circuits.
