Consumer-grade routers rarely have these ports, so a separate ONT is usually required. Media Converters and Limitations While media converters exist to convert fiber to Ethernet, they are generally not compatible with GPON or XGPON protocols used by ISPs for fiber internet. Attempting to connect a standard router directly to a fiber line without an ONT or compatible SFP module will usually fail because the router cannot interpret the optical signals. Summary Typical home routers: Do not have fiber ports; require an ONT to convert fiber to Ethernet. Routers with SFP/SFP+ ports: Can connect directly to fiber if the correct module is used. Media converters: Only work for Ethernet-compatible fiber, not GPON/XGPON used by most ISPs. In most residential setups, the fiber optic cable connects first to an ONT, which then links to your router via Ethernet, enabling high...
