ITC (Instrumentation Tray Cable) ITC cables are intended for low-voltage control and instrumentation circuits (≤ 150 volts, ≤ 5 amps) such as PLCs, DCS systems, and transmitters (NEC Article 727). They are available in shielded or unshielded constructions, often with twisted pairs to reduce electromagnetic interference. ITC cables may also have an ER rating for short exposed runs, but must be continuously supported. PLTC (Power-Limited Tray Cable) PLTC cables are low-voltage, power-limited cables suitable for control, fire alarm, and building automation systems. They are rated for 300 volts a...
